What Is a DWID?

A DWID or domestic water improvement district is a special taxing district established through the county board of supervisors for the purpose of providing potable water to its member lands.

How Does SHDWID Work?

SHDWID is governed by a board of five members elected from the district for a term of four years. The terms are staggered and so an election is held every two years. The board elects a chairman, vice-chairman and secretary from its members annually. Should a member not be able to fulfill the four-year term, the board appoints a qualified applicant from the district. Any qualified elector from the district, who is a resident of the district, is eligible to serve on the board.

The district and its board are governed by the Mohave County Board of Supervisors and Arizona Revised Statutes. Unlike a privately owned water company, SHDWID is not governed by Arizona Corporation Commission

§ARS 38-431.02 states that a DWID will hold a meeting open to the public and that an agenda of the meeting be posted in a public place. SHDWID holds a meeting open to the public the third Monday of every month at 4345 So-Hi Blvd. The agenda is posted on the signboard at the corner of So-Hi Blvd. and Ranch Road. Minutes for the previous meeting are also posted on the signboard.
